Correspondence

No correspondence to report.

Treasurer

As of 9/30/23 there was a balance of \$45,389.49. Membership funds of approximately \$4,600 have been received. There were large expenses for AEDs of \$6,500 and \$2,800 for mosquito spray. Ami was reimbursed \$775 for the AED cabinets and Mary was reimbursed for WIX fees. The BLT supplies from Amazon (\$450) and the 2 large buoys (\$805 plus shipping) were paid for.

Water Updates

1. Water Quality & Fish

- Water testing is done and results will be sent on to the State. They will give their analysis in February.
- 1,000 perch have been ordered for stocking.

Community Affairs

1. Road Cleanup

Mary Kowalski has 30 vests and trash bags for the Baldwin/Long/Coverdale road cleanup on 10/21. Group to meet at Mills at 9:30.

2. AEDs & CPR

- The three AED units and three first aid kits have been procured. (Susan to look for waterproof containers to hold the first aid kits.) They will be located at the Labash home on the north bay, the Schirott home on the main lake, and the Johnson home on Little Baldwin. First aid flags will be displayed to designate these homes, and flyers will be posted at Zimmy's, Hall's, George's, and Mills.
- Andy Hartman of SEPSA will do training for the AEDs and also a hands-on CPR course (informational - not a certificate course). We are checking into January for that training. He is willing to do a full CPR course for the lake this summer if there is interest. Possible dates in May are being explored. More information to come.

3. Tree Program
